



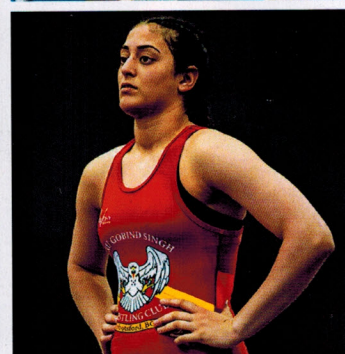
LAUREN CLEMENTS (Terry Fox) – Basketball

Dunked a career high 45 points in a semi-final win over Okanagan Mission at the BC Senior Girls AAAA tournament then contributed 17 points and 15 rebounds despite considerable coverage in the Ravens' 77-75 win over Riverside in the final. Clements, an outstanding two-way player, closed out her high school hoop career in being named MVP for the tournament, which was her school's first senior girls' basketball title.



MAELLA HODGSON (Elgin Park) – Athletics

An outstanding middle distance runner, Hodgson dominated the junior ranks at the 2022 BC High School Track and Field Championships, winning the 3,000 metres, finishing second in the 1,500 and 4th in the 800. Her efforts gave Elgin Park the top junior team award at the provincial meet. Hodgson also sped to victory in the 1,500 metres at the U18 National Legion Championships and finished second in the 3,000 metres.



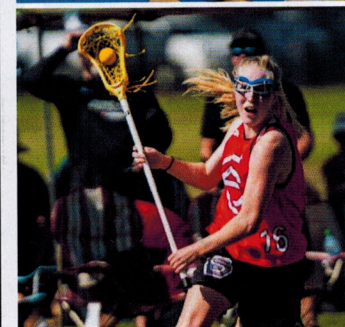
RUPINDER JOHAL (Robert Bateman) – Wrestling

Went undefeated in BC high school competition in 2022 and did not give up a single point in the high school season. Johal also won the U19 national championship in her weight class and dominated at the Cadet U17 Pan Am Championships in Argentina, winning the Golden Boot award as the event's outstanding female wrestler. She also served as Team BC flagbearer at the Canada Summer Games and won gold in her weight class and team event.



MARINA RODOCAJ (R.A. McMath) – Volleyball, Basketball

Propelled her McMath Wildcats to first-ever provincial AAA championships in both volleyball and basketball. Rodocaj was named most outstanding player at the Senior Girls AAA volleyball championships and also earned MVP honours in Richmond League, South Fraser and Provincial basketball championships, where she scored 20 points in a 51-46 win over MEI Eagles. Rodocaj also earned a silver medal with the Canadian U16 squad at FIBA Americas in Mexico.



RORY ROTHNIE (Claremont) – Lacrosse

Served as captain for the BC team that earned a silver medal at the 2022 Canada Summer Games in Niagara, Ont., losing 2-1 to Ontario in the final. Rothnie, from Victoria, was also named to the 2021 and 2022 Team BC Field Lacrosse teams. She has received an academic scholarship to Brown University for the fall of 2023 and will play on the women's lacrosse team.
